The Council of Trent (1545-1563) solemnly approved and recommended the procession on Corpus Christi as a public profession of the Catholic faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament

During the later Middle Ages these processions developed into splendid pageants of devotion and honor to the Blessed Sacrament. They are still publicly held and often with ancient splendor in such places as Portugal, Austria, Belgium, Ireland, the Catholic sections of Germany, Holland, Switzerland, Canada, Hungary, and in the Baltic countries and South America. Sovereigns and princes, presidents and ministers of state, magistrates, members of trade and craft guilds, and noble guards of the armed forces accompany the liturgical procession with the church bells pealing and the people singing and the bands playing.
